

Backstage Arts

A design method for 'Two'

After discussions with the Director about the feel of an '80s northern English pub, the process moves from a rough drawing into a 3D programme called 'Sketchup.' It is here that size and scale can be observed and understood within the limits of the actual theatre space.







From 'Sketchup' the model is then imported into a lighting software programme called 'Capture' where the lighting positions and techniques can be applied with renderings to produce an image of a certain scene or moment in the play.





We hope you enjoy the look and feel of the play as much as we have had fun creating this for you.
